APPLE CHUTNEY USING HONEY

- 1.5kg cooking apples, peeled, cored & chopped
- 1.5kg onions, peeled and chopped
- 375g raisins
- 50g fresh ginger, grated
- 1 green pepper, seeded & chopped
- 1 teaspoon mustard powder
- 1 teaspoon ground coriander
- 3 garlic cloves, crushed
- 900ml honey
- 450ml vinegar



Leaving out the honey, put all ingredients into a large saucepan and bring slowly to boil, stirring occasionally.

Reduce heat and simmer for about 2 hours or until very thick.

Stir frequently to prevent sticking

Add honey and bring to boil again

Pour into jars and cover when cold.

HONEY BANANA BISCUITS

| | |
|-----------------------------------|-----------------------------|
| 125g butter | 1 cup coconut |
| ½ cup brown sugar, lightly packed | Pinch nutmeg |
| ¼ cup honey | 2 cups SR Flour |
| 1 egg | 1 ½ cups crushed Cornflakes |

1 large banana, mashed

Cream butter, sugar & honey until light & fluffy, add egg, beat well. Add mashed banana & coconut, beat well.

Fold in sifted flour & nutmeg. Drop teaspoonfuls of mixture on to Cornflakes, roll lightly to coat mixture.

Place on greased oven trays, bake in mod. oven approx. 12 minutes or until light golden brown.

MAKES APPROX. 50 BISCUITS

HONEY DATE & NUT CAKE

| | |
|---------------------------|-----------------------|
| 1 cup honey | ¼ cup chopped walnuts |
| 1 cup water | ¼ cup chopped almonds |
| 1 tablespoon golden syrup | 2 ¼ cups SR Flour |
| 30g butter | 1 teas ground ginger |
| 250g chopped dates | ½ teas mixed spice |

Combine honey, water, golden syrup & butter in saucepan. Stir constantly over heat without boiling until butter is melted. Remove from heat, cool to room temperature. Grease an 18cm cake tin, line base with paper. Stir dates, walnuts & almonds, then sifted dry ingredients into honey mixture.

Stir until combined. Pour mixture into prepared tin. Bake in mod. oven for about 50 minutes.

Cool in tin.

Leave uniced.

HONEY COCONUT CAKE

| | |
|----------------------------------|---------------------|
| ½ cup coconut | 2 tablespoons honey |
| 125g butter | 1 ½ cups SR Flour |
| ¾ cup brown sugar, firmly packed | ½ cup milk |
| 2 eggs | |

CARAMEL ICING

| | |
|-------------------|----------------------|
| 60g butter | 2 tablespoons milk |
| ½ cup brown sugar | 1 ½ cups icing sugar |

Grease a 20cm pan, line base with paper. Stir coconut constantly over heat in heavy based pan until light golden brown. Remove from pan to cool. Cream butter & sugar with electric mixer until light & fluffy, beat in eggs one at a time. Add honey, beat until combined. Stir in toasted coconut, half the sifted flour & half the milk.

Stir in remaining flour and milk. Spread mixture into prepared pan. Bake in mod. oven for about 35 minutes.

Stand for 5 minutes before turning cake out onto wire rack to cool. Spread cold cake with icing, sprinkle with extra coconut.

ICING: Melt butter in saucepan, add sugar, stir constantly over heat without boiling for about 2 minutes. Stir in milk then gradually stir in sifted icing sugar. Stir until smooth.

LEMON HONEY DROPS

| | |
|---------------------|--------------------------------|
| 125g butter | 1 tablespoon grated lemon rind |
| ¼ cup castor sugar | 1 ¾ cups SR Flour |
| 2 tablespoons honey | ¾ cup coconut |
| 1 egg | 1/3 cup lemon butter |

Cream butter, sugar & honey together in bowl. Add egg & lemon rind. Beat well.

Gradually fold in sifted flour. Drop teaspoonfuls of mixture into coconut. Roll into balls in palm of hand.

Place on greased oven trays. Make a small indentation with little finger in top centre of each biscuit.

Carefully spoon small quantity of lemon butter into indentation. Bake in moderate oven approx. 12 to 15 minutes. Cool on trays. MAKES APPROX. 30 BISCUITS.

HONEY TEA LOAF

2/3 cup cold tea
1 tablespoon water
4 tablespoons honey
2 cups mixed fruit
1 egg, beaten
250g SR Flour
Honey for glazing

Combine first 3 ingredients, pour over fruit & soak overnight. Add beaten egg to fruit mixture, beat well.

Add sifted flour, mix well. Pour into well-greased loaf tin (14 x 22cm). Bake in moderate oven for 1 hour until cooked. Cool in tin for 10 minutes, then remove. Brush top of loaf with extra honey. Store in airtight container for a few days to improve flavour.

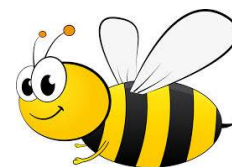
